EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Peaks Gymnastics, in collaboration with our key stakeholders, completed a Strategic Plan which outlined three Strategic Directions:

- 1. Development & Retention
- 2. Performance & Individual Excellence
- 3. Sustainability & Funding

From this third Strategic Direction came the goal to build a Peaks Gymnastics training facility for the Columbia Valley. This new facility will not only create operational sustainability for Peaks but will also provide more opportunities for health and recreation programming for the wider community.

The District of Invermere's Official Community Plan states a desire to be a destination of choice, as well as the centre of recreational opportunities of the upper Columbia Valley. Section 2.4 point 3 outlines "the District will support and foster ongoing community awareness of cultural and recreational activities and appreciation of culture and recreation as an integral part of life in Invermere. This will involve the continued support of the Windermere Valley Arts and Cultural Society, Pynelogs, the development of future cultural and recreational facilities and the support of local sports and youth groups". This project then aligns with the DOI's goal of supporting and fostering recreational programming as integral to the life of Invermere residents, while also supporting the development of recreational facilities for sports and youth groups.




The new facility will enhance the lifestyle of the people of the Columbia Valley, from 18 months to adulthood, with programming including recreational and competitive gymnastics, parkour, trampoline and tumbling, preschool play and learn programming, birthday parties, camps, school field trips and cross-training opportunities for Dance, Free-Style Skiing, Cheer and Alpine Skiing. With a permanent Peaks home, programming is able to double and Peaks will have the ability to host Regional Competitions and sold-out Year End Shows.

The demand for gymnastics within Invermere and the surrounding area is continually high as gymnastics is the foundation of all sports. Peaks is able to attract children from walking age and continue to develop these youth to competitive athletes. Our goal is for gymnastics to be attainable for all. As such, Peaks strives to be the lowest cost gymnastics programming in the Kootenays, maintaining accessibility. The innovative Team at Peaks works diligently at offering programs that appeal to all spectrums of athletes and ages from the Parent and Tot program, to Parkour, to our competitive stream of athletes.

Peaks Gymnastics has a long history of making existing buildings work for our gymnastics programming. Since Peaks Gymnastics became a not-for-profit society, once again, nine years ago after a brief two year period of private ownership, it consistently has waiting lists and capacity issues for the competitive, recreational, parkour programs, birthday parties and camps. The club also is currently in a space that is not large enough to have a full competition floor and does not fit all of our gymnastics equipment. Additionally, the club experiences female athlete dropout as the space does not grow with the athletes, supporting acquisition of more difficult skills. The Canadian Association for the Advancement of Women in Sport, the Coaching Association of Canada and Canadian Jump Start have created the Keeping Girls in Sport program, recognizing the challenges for girls in sport, as for every boy that leaves sport, two girls leave. We have an opportunity to make a major impact on the youth in the Columbia Valley and it is time to reach our maximum potential and provide the Columbia Valley with the gymnastics and community recreation opportunities that they deserve.



Peaks Gymnastics is very fortunate to have a Board of Directors with the expertise and energy to move Gymnastics to meet its potential within the Columbia Valley. The Strategic Plan that was created exemplifies our ability to listen to the community, set goals and subsequently plan to achieve those goals. For this particular Building Project, the Board of Directors of the Society have struck a committee comprised of Board members and members of the Community with expertise in construction. Jon Martin, President of Echelon Homes Inc brings a wealth of design and construction engineering particularly in the area of energy efficiency.

Head Coach and Program Director, with the direction of the Board of Directors, is ultimately responsible for the Operations of Peak Gymnastics. In establishing a Strategic Plan, we have been able to create a 5-year Operational Plan for Peaks Gymnastics. The Program Director, with the assistance of the Board of Directors will be responsible to oversee and execute that plan. The Program Director provides leadership and direction consistent with the mission and vision of Peaks Gymnastics and keeps the Board of Directors informed of Peaks performance against the business plan and any major developments, ensuring the Board has sufficient information to permit it to discuss performance, potential issues and to make decisions. Our Program Director successfully oversees the interfaces between Peaks Gymnastics and its membership, volunteers, corporate partners and the public by developing and implementing a communications program which supports the broad objectives of a communications strategy aimed at enhancing the profile and image of Peaks Gymnastics.

Peaks Program Director is also the Head Coach of Peaks Gymnastics. As Head Coach, this individual is the most highly trained and certified coach at Peaks following the Coaches Development pathway as outlined in Gym BC guidelines. In gymnastics you must have a certain Coaching level, both trained and certified, in order to coach a certain level of gymnast or a particular discipline like Parkour and Trampoline

Peaks has shown success and strives to continually maintain and grow our professional coaching staff. Our coaching strategy includes developing coaches to their highest coaching level, developing coaches for the specific disciplines or programs offered, salary, mentorship program, and accomplishing their desired outcomes for the Gymnastics Club. The Coach in Training (CIT) program has been significant in succession planning for coaches where athletes that are part of the program start learning to coach in high school. This year we have 6 athletes that are in our High School program and have graduated from the CIT program and are now coaching the younger athletes. Peaks is proud of the growing year-round employment opportunities created and offered to our community.

ABOUT THE PROJECT



Peaks Gymnastics has developed a relationship with Lake WIndermere and District Lions Club and are grateful in obtaining a lease on their land off of Lakeview Drive for \$1 a year. With the location being close to the highway, it serves as more accessible to the entire Columbia Valley. The proposed building is 8,000 ft.





Peaks Gymnastics Market Analysis Summary

Invermere and surrounding Columbia Valley has seen steady, healthy growth in its population over the past 5 years. Invermere grew 15.5% from a population of slightly more than 3,391 in the 2016 census to 3,917 in the most recent 2021 census. In the past 10 years, Invermere has seen a growth rate of 32.5%.

With surrounding areas also seeing significant increases, Columbia Valley Vital Signs notes a 23.3% population increase to the Columbia Valley from 2016 as indicated by the 2021 census.

With the draw of lifestyle and recreation, the growing ease of working remotely as well as retirees moving into their second home here permanently, it is fair to expect the growth of our Valley to continue to steadily rise.







Household Recreation Expenditures

According to the 2019 census, the average Canadian expenditure per household on Recreation was \$4,624. The median household income in Invermere, BC is lower than the national household median income, so it is fair to assume this amount may less that is spent by local families on recreation. This also highlights the need to maintain accessible pricing.

Competitors

Peaks Gymnastics Society does not have any direct competition as the next closest Gymnastics Club is in Golden or Kimberly and Cranbrook.

Our club could experience indirect competition with other sports groups if a child is having to choose between two activities due to scheduling conflicts or financial resource limitations. Our accessible pricing, and scheduling options are key factors in addressing this challenge. With our goal to continue to offer these programs to be accessible by all in our community we have been able to keep our costs affordable. We know this as we continually monitor what the surrounding gymnastics clubs are charging. We strive to keep our costs down while being a successful enterprising nonprofit offering competitive above standard living wages.

Competing for the Household Recreation Expenditure Peaks Gymnastics Competitive Edge

Peaks Gymnastics Society's competitive edge for attaining Columbia Valley's household expenditure is simply that gymnastics is the foundation of all sport. Gymnastics is the first sport most children participate in since there is programming suitable once the child can walk. Providing the fundamentals for all sport sets us apart and makes gymnastics the first step for a child, before exploring other sport options.

Peaks Gymnastics has a naturally successful attraction and retention strategy. The fun, positive, rewarding programs attract young children into the club. Being able to start at an early age, and being the first sport of a child, creates an opportunity for early retention. Furthermore, Peaks Gymnastics continues to integrate and further develop athletes from other sports. Peaks has partnered with various ski teams, dance & figure skating club and has offered extension programs that continue to develop the communities recreational programming, including parkour & dodgeball.

Peaks Gymnastics Opportunity for Growth

The opportunity for growth extends beyond what we are currently capable of offering to the community. The new facility will be an asset to all cohorts of the community and will develop recreation for all.

Peaks Gymnastics Society has an opportunity for growth in the preschool aged market and child aged 5-9. By using the marketing strategy of being the foundation in all sport, and having a space to provide more classes for this age group (morning, evening and weekends), and space for operating more than one class at a time, we have an opportunity to see an increase in enrollment in the 1-4 and 5-9 aged group and opportunity to establish early retention.

The opportunity for cross sport training is significant when moving to a larger space that is able to support this. From dance, skating, hockey, skiing and more, many sports look to gymnastics facilities to support conditioning and skill development.

Continual development of extension programs including parkour for ages 6-14, which the club is successfully offering, would be able to further develop and evolve with a new facility. Dodgeball would be another sport that the club could execute with the proposed facility. These programs would develop the community's recreational offerings.

FEASIBILITY

There is an opportunity to collaborate with schools, preschools and homeschools, providing children an opportunity to have fun while learning the fundamentals of sport. This will provide a gymnastics experience to children who have not yet had the opportunity, and increase enrollment from the positive experience. This opportunity continues to develop with after school outreach programs, offering the community a program that incorporates both homework & activity.

Gymnastics Summer Camps have been popular and successful. Greater space will allow Peaks to run summer camps weekly while simultaneously offering other needed programs for the competitive athletes, and play and learn primary year programming. These multiple offerings will meet all needs and create greater opportunity for retention.

An additional source of revenue and method of sustainability would include incorporating play & learn classes. According to the 2017 Columbia Valley Child Care Needs and Demand Assessment there is a shortage of child care spots in our valley. The survey concluded "The Columbia Valley would benefit socially and economically if additional child care services were provided". The Pre-school gymnastic camps can be scheduled during the day which are low activity times in the gymnastics centre. The key to marketing and promoting to the parents of preschool age children is the benefits of gymnastics for their child's physical and cognitive development.


We believe the opportunities to continue to develop the community recreation through this facility are in abundance as we would be able to accommodate other user groups that require space to operate.






†† FUNDING

- **Events:** Peaks was thrilled to provide the community with a 2022 Year End Show to not only show case the hard work of the youth in the programming but also raise funds for its building goal. Peaks successfully profited \$12,250.
- **Grants:** Peaks has acquired a successful relationship with Natasha Chaykowski who delivers great skill in grant writing and invaluable knowledge. (See prospective funding chart).
- Local Government: Peaks Gymnastics has successfully and invariably operated as an enterprising not-for-profit, without any ongoing financial support of local government for operations. Peaks looks forward to continuing to do so however, is seeking to obtain one-time financial support from local government to support the funding of this community asset. The requests to local government is \$210,000 broken down as \$70,000 over 3 years.
- **Loan:** Peaks is currently working with Columbia Basin Trust to acquire a \$250,000 loan.

2.4 Education, Recreation, Arts & Culture Policies

Invermere is the centre for educational, cultural and artistic opportunities for the Upper Columbia Valley. The community is home to David Thompson Senior Secondary School, College of the Rockies, Eddie Mountain Memorial Arena, Pynelogs Cultural Centre, Invermere and District Library, Windermere Valley Museum and Joe Peters Memorial Curling Rink. As well it is host to several valley functions that include Wings over the Rockies Bird Festival, Loop the Lake, Lake Windermere Triathlon, Bonspiel on the Lake.

From hosting Canada Day Celebrations, to being the home of the Columbia Valley Rockies Ice Hockey Club, to building a record breaking Whiteway on the lake, to becoming an adventure tourist destination, Invermere seeks to be a destination of choice.

3.9 PARKS & OPEN SPACE

INTRODUCTION
