2. Purpose of Grant.

This project ensures children have equitable access to modern technology, fostering exploration, creation, and hands-on learning.

The grant will enable the Cranbrook Public Library to replace five 7-year-old tablets and one equally aged computer in the children's library. Technology has advanced rapidly in the past years, and the existing tablets and computer can no longer support current apps. The refresh will support both general use by children and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) programming.

The updated tablets will be loaded with apps for coding, design, and other STEAM concepts, and that encourage the development of literacy skills, while the computer will provide access to educational software and online resources.

The Cranbrook Public Library serves the residents of RDEK Area C, the City of Cranbrook and ?a'qam.

Any children who visit the Library will be able to use these devices for free. They can participate in STEAM programs, such as Science Saturdays, where the tablets will be used from time to time. There may also be opportunities for the Library to partner with reading centres to offer STEAM programs to children directly in Area C communities.

4. Benefits.

Approximately 15.3% of residents living in Area C are children under the age of 15. Some of these children have limited access to technology in their homes.

This project will give those children, plus those living in Cranbrook access to new technology that they can use to learn and develop their digital literacy skills. The equipment will also improve the Library's ability to offer and sustain high-quality STEAM programming.

The Library determined that this was a worthwhile project based on the usage of the existing tablets and children's computer, plus the popularity of current STEAM programs.
